PNM Project Receives 100K Strong in the Americas **Innovation Grant**



Deeper Spatial Statistical Insights into Small Geographic Area Data Uncertainty

Dr. Daniel A. Griffith, Ashbel Smith Professor of GIS, Dr. Yongwan Chun, Associate Professor of GIS, and Monghyeon Lee, GIS PhD student, have published a paper about big spatial data with regard to their uncertainty through georeferenced data, coupled with small geographic areas. Impacts of interest concern the nature, degree, and mixture of spatial autocorrelation.


