Dr. Kim Investigates Preparedness for New Disease Outbreaks in South Korea

Dr. Dohyeong Kim, associate professor of public policy and political economy and of geospatial information sciences, and his co-authors have used historical data to evaluate whether South Korea is prepared for future outbreaks of infectious diseases like COVID-19. Spatial allocation methods can indicate specific locations which governments should allocate funds to install NPIRs, one of the most critical resources for controlling infectious respiratory diseases.


