## RDC and UTD

- UTD is part of the DFW RDC Consortium and pay to help support it
- What this means to you, as a researcher at the RDC, is that the financial cost of using the RDC is heavily offset and, in many cases, is free
- **A researcher *not* part of the Consortium or RDC network that wants to work in our RDC at the Dallas Fed Dallas will pay up to \$20,000 a year**
  - **This is free to UTD associated faculty and graduate students with approved projects – this can be included as the value of University-supported in-kind support in grant applications**
- This does not necessarily mean there are no financial costs, as some data owners charge for their data; however, both through the RDC and through UTD, we are looking to pick up these costs when possible

## DFW Research Data Center Grant

### Overview

The UT Dallas Research Data Center (RDC) Grant is an internal funding mechanism designed to encourage the development of proposals to conduct research in the DFW-RDC that have a strong likelihood of leading to external funding.

- The UTD Office of Research has set up a separate seed grant program to help encourage RDC use
- Awards up to \$10,000 to help researchers prepare a fundable project will be made to UTD tenured/tenure-track faculty or center directors
- The initial Proposal Deadline is **April 15, 2020**
